**NATIONAL GUARD BUREAU AWARDS TOMPKINS BUILDERS
\$98 Million Contract to Construct Army National Guard Readiness Center
Addition in Arlington Hall Station, VA.**

Tompkins Builders of Washington, D.C., was recently awarded a \$98 Million contract by the National Guard Bureau to construct the Army National Guard Readiness Center Addition in Arlington Hall Station, VA. This is the second National Guard Readiness Center Tompkins has been selected to build, the first center was completed in 1993.

The scope of work includes a new 250,000 sq. ft. addition to the current Army National Guard Center that is designed to meet all force protection (ATFP) requirements and corresponding site work improvement. Upon completion in 2010, the project will seek a LEED Silver Certification from the United States Green Building Council.

Ed Small, President of Tompkins Builders said, "We are extremely proud to have been selected to continue to support the BRAC program with this important project for the National Guard Bureau."

This is the third BRAC project awarded to Tompkins Builders. The firm is also constructing the \$50 Million Sustainment Center of Excellence (SCOE) Headquarters in Ft. Lee, Va. and, as part of a joint venture, the \$477 Million C4ISR Center of Excellence Campus and Headquarters at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md.
